But my prayer for each of us this August is something different.

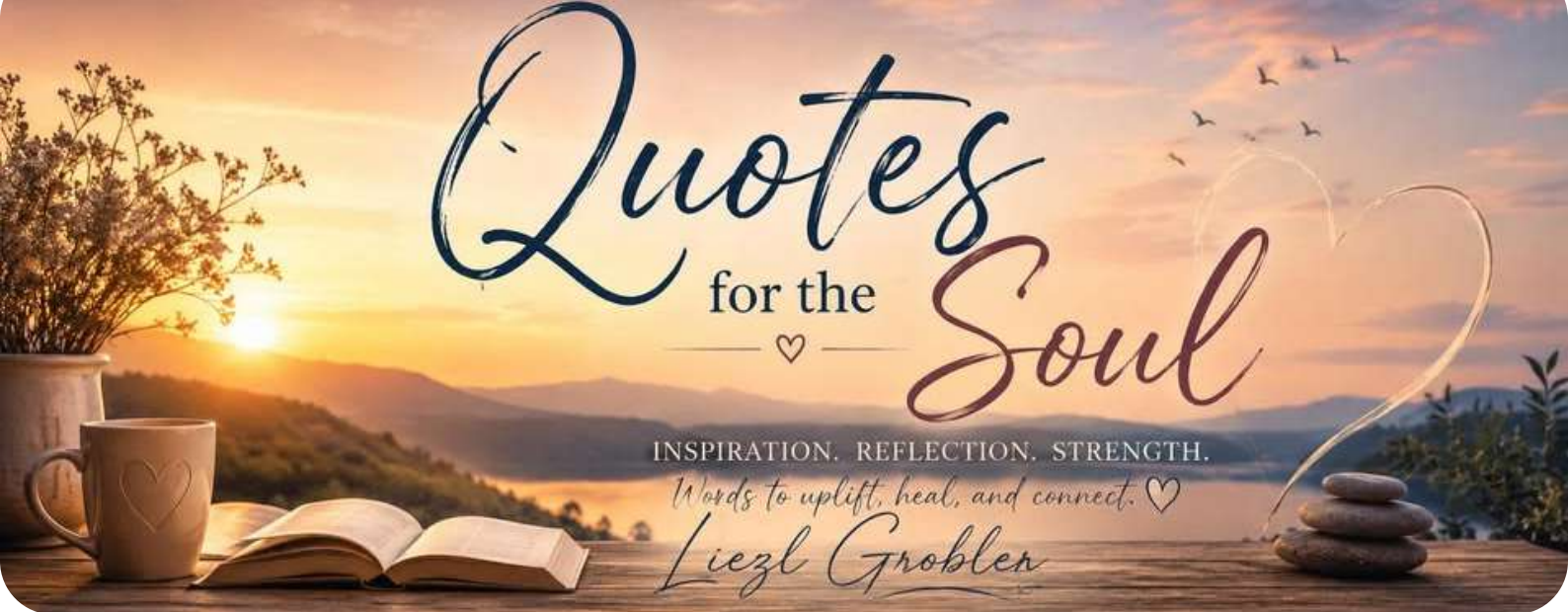

Every ministry has a beginning. How was Quotes for the Soul born?

"It began during one of the hardest seasons of my life."

"During that season, God picked me up, healed my heart, and shaped me into a stronger and better person."

As she spent time in God's Word, she began creating beautiful images with Bible verses using PicsArt. Later, a dear friend introduced her to Pinterest, opening up even more creative possibilities.

Then, in January 2015, Quotes for the Soul officially became a Facebook page.

Looking back today, she says she could never have imagined how far God would take this simple act of obedience.

Where does your inspiration come from?

Liezl's answer is wonderfully uncomplicated.

"I become still before God."

Before every post, she spends quiet moments listening.

"I know when He is speaking to me and confirming the Scripture He wants me to share. Everything we do, we do for the Lord."

Perhaps that is why each post feels less like a quotation and more like a gentle whisper from heaven.

Is there one Scripture that has shaped your life more than any other?

Without hesitation, she answers:

Psalm 91.

For Liezl, it is much more than a favourite chapter in the Bible.

"It reminds me that God is my refuge, my protector, and my safe place."

During difficult seasons, Psalm 91 has become an anchor for her soul.

"It reminds me that I am never alone. God covers me under His wings, cares for me, and carries me through every challenge. His promises fill me with peace and strengthen my faith every single day."

Social media can often feel heavy and overwhelming. How do you keep your page filled with hope?

Liezl intentionally chooses a different path.

"The world already gives us enough negativity."

Instead of focusing on fear, she fills her own heart with Scripture before sharing it with others.

"I choose every day to keep my eyes on God. With Him there is always hope for tomorrow, confidence in His plan, and the assurance that He will carry me through every season."

One of her favourite personal reminders says it perfectly:

"With God in my life, I choose every day to embrace light instead of darkness, hope instead of fear, and faith instead of doubt."

Have you ever wanted to give up?

Her answer may surprise many of her readers.

"There was a time when I stopped posting for six months."

Life became busy. Work and family responsibilities filled her days, and she thought she simply needed a break.

But something was missing.

"I felt empty."

Then the messages began arriving.

People wrote to tell her how much the daily encouragement meant to them and how deeply they missed the page.

"I prayed and asked the Lord what He wanted me to do." His answer was clear.

"He reminded me to keep 'fishing' for Him, to continue sharing His love, His hope, and His Word."

That moment changed everything.

"I realised that Quotes for the Soul is not just a Facebook page. It is a ministry."

One of the many the lesson God taught me:

I first discovered Katie's Instagram page almost a year ago, and I was immediately drawn to the beautiful way she spoke about Jesus while encouraging women to embrace the colours and styles that suit them best. Her message goes far beyond fashion, it is about discovering the confidence and beauty that God has lovingly placed within each of us.

It is a joy to share her beautiful story with you.

How Did I Become an Image Consultant?

Honestly, this wasn't some big plan I had. I've always loved fashion and being the person people come to for makeovers, styling advice, or makeup tips. I've also always loved having a mic in my hand, speaking, and being in the center of attention. In the world's eyes, that can look vain, someone who loves shopping, dressing beautifully, and wanting so much attention on a platform. But God is using all of that for His kingdom, and that's what changed everything for me.

I got into image consulting solely through Jesus. No one told me about it. I didn't follow a single Instagram page about image consulting. But while I was serving at church, I felt God telling me to pursue this gift He'd always put in me, to help women feel beautiful and reach their full potential while still serving the Lord. So, I took the course, and that's when it clicked. God was giving me a tool called image consulting and styling, and He was going to use it for His kingdom. I prayed for a long time before starting my business, and once I got confirmation, the clients just started rolling in. Not because I did anything special, but because I truly trusted Jesus and His timing. Being obedient always carries fruit.

As it says in Colossians 3:17, **"And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."** That's exactly what this is. My business has been God's business from day one. I cannot imagine running it for even one second without God as the owner, the CEO, and the one guiding and providing. *The real blessing?* Seeing the fruit in the women I work with, watching them realize they were created with such intention and purpose. That's such evidence of God's work and such a blessing.

Finding Your Value vs. Your Identity in How You Look

God created us in His image. Genesis 1:27 says, **"So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them."** Because of that, we should take our image seriously. How we dress and present ourselves matters, it draws people toward us, and that's important because it can draw them toward Jesus too.

Women were created so beautifully. I truly believe we are God's most beautiful creation, more than any sunset, more than any flower. He sees women as His masterpiece. So how we treat ourselves should reflect that value. But here's the thing: your identity has nothing to do with how you look. Your worth doesn't lie in your clothes or your appearance. Your worth lies in something so much deeper, your identity in Christ and what He calls you in His Word.

A woman who knows her identity in Christ always looks lovely and put together. That's not a coincidence. It starts from the inside. It starts from the heart. Matthew 12:34 tells us, **"For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks."** When you know your worth and your value in Jesus, it overflows onto how you dress, how you look, and how you present yourself. And it will all be for the honor of God, not yourself.

Beauty that the world sees and the type of beauty that pulls people toward you because of how you look, that should be seen as a gift from Jesus. A gift that's meant to be used for His kingdom and to glorify Him. That's where the lines get blurred for so many women. They think their worth lies in what they wear or how they look. But when you know your godly value, when you know your identity in Christ, everything changes. Your appearance becomes an overflow of that identity, not the source of it.

How to See Yourself Through God's Eyes Through Changing Bodies and Aging

The first thing we need to do is ask ourselves a very honest, raw question: Am I stewarding my body through food and movement to the best of my ability? Your body is a gift that God trusted you with. It's your temple. When you're taking responsibility for that, you're honoring what He's given you.

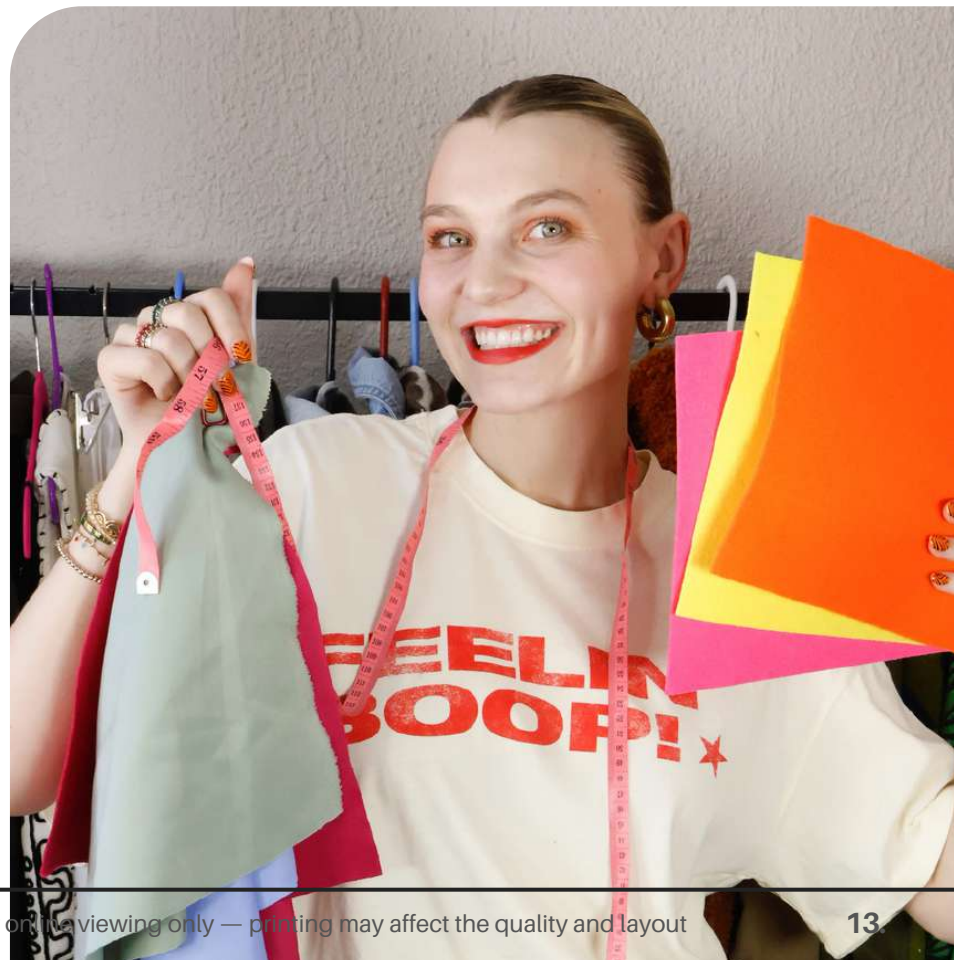
But here's the deeper truth: God knows the number of hairs on your head. He knows what's going to come out of your mouth before you say it. God has never made a mistake, and He never will.

So why would He have made a mistake with your nose, your eyes, your hips, your body? He didn't. Every single part of you is exactly as it should be, placed there for the purpose He has for you on this earth. Psalm 139 reminds us just how intentional God is, He knit you together in your mother's womb with such purpose and precision.

You are perfectly created. And honestly? It's a big testimony when women look at themselves in the mirror, knowing they don't fit the world's standard of beauty, and still choose to love their body, to celebrate how they were created. That's powerful. That's a witness to God's goodness. When you find peace, love, and wholeness looking at yourself in the mirror, knowing you're stewarding yourself to the best of your abilities and that God knit you together with such purpose, that's when things shift.

Truth bomb: If the enemy can get you to hate yourself, he can so easily make you hate others.

Because here's what we're really doing when we reject how God made us: we're disrespecting God. We're telling Him that the way He calls beautiful isn't good enough. That the way He created you isn't beautiful enough. That's not stewarding; that's rejecting His work.

So pray. Ask the Holy Spirit and Jesus to show you how He sees you. Trust that He will show up and reveal to you the truth about who you are. Because the way He sees you is the only view that matters.

How I Implement Scripture to Change My Life and My Client's Life Through Image Consulting

I don't think image consulting alone is going to change your whole life. And I don't think just quoting scripture constantly to hurting, broken women is going to change their whole life either. It might plant seeds, because the Word never returns empty, but transformation takes more than that.

For a season in my life, I realized I didn't know my Christ-like identity. And because of that, I gathered biblical statements about what God and Scripture call me. I learned that **I am a royal priest** (1 Peter 2:9), that I have the **mind of Christ** (1 Corinthians 2:16), that I am **a new creation** (2 Corinthians 5:17), and that I am **a co-heir with Christ** (Romans 8:17).

also learned that I am chosen (Ephesians 1:4), that I am loved (John 3:16), that I am forgiven (Ephesians 1:7), that I am worthy (1 Peter 2:4), that I am strong (Philippians 4:13), and that I am redeemed (Titus 2:14).

I prayed these statements over my life for a period of time until the Holy Spirit confirmed to me: you now know who you are. And that made a massive change in my life. It wasn't overnight, but it was real. It was deep. It shifted everything.

If I could give women advice, it would be: Pray these scriptures over your life. Don't just read them. Speak them. Declare them. Let the Holy Spirit work them into your heart until you actually believe them about yourself. Because when you know who you are in Christ, when it moves from your head to your heart ... that's when the transformation happens.

That's when you start dressing differently, carrying yourself differently, treating yourself differently. Not because of image consulting, but because you finally understand your true identity. And everything flows from there.

A Biblical Woman That Has Influenced Me Greatly in My Journey With Jesus

The biblical woman that has influenced me greatly is Esther. My parents prayed over me when I turned 21, and I see so much of her character and her story in my own life journey. Esther went through hardship, uncertainty, and fear. She didn't feel equipped or ready for what God was calling her to do. But God used her to save a nation.

And I think that's so important for us to understand: ask Jesus to show you, even if it's just a glimpse, what He wants to use you for. What gifts has He placed within you? In your personality, in your talents, in who you are. What has He given you to go and change the kingdom? Because here's the truth: you will never feel enough. You will never feel smart enough, good enough, or equipped enough to do what God has called you to do. But that's not the point. The point is to allow Him to use you. To allow Him to use your brains, your talent, your looks, whatever He wants to use for His kingdom.

Luke 9:23 says, **"Then He said to them all: 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.'"** That's exactly what we need to do, crucify our flesh, crucify our desires, crucify our plans every single morning. Pick up your cross and lay it down at His feet.

Jesus, I want to crucify my flesh and my dreams and my desires for what You want. I want to lay myself at the altar of Your feet to be used by You in every single way, to save nations, to save generations. I want to honor You in every single area of my life. From how I dress to how I speak, to the quiet moments when no one is watching, to my marriage, to the mother I'm one day going to be. I want to honor You through everything. Help me to be bold and brave and available.



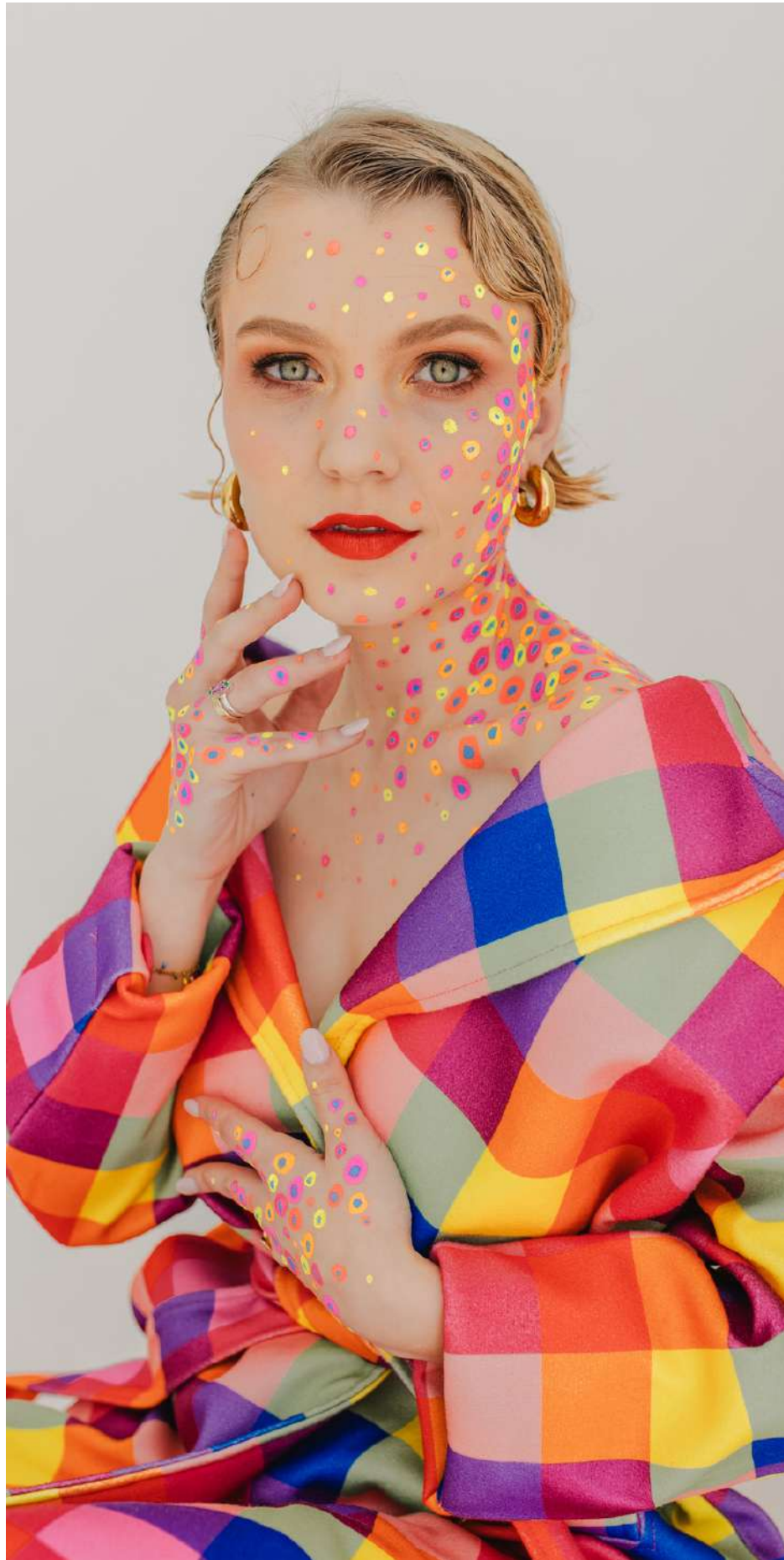

To women who feel lost in their identity, who feel unseen, who feel like a mistake, who feel unworthy, my challenge to you is this: go into the presence of Jesus and ask the Holy Spirit where did this lie originate. Because it is a lie from the enemy. It is not the truth.

Lies that tell us we're not good enough usually come from someone who hurt us. Someone spoke something over us, or we experienced something that made us believe we weren't worthy. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal that to you. And then, forgive. Forgive that person, forgive the circumstance, forgive yourself. Because unforgiveness keeps you bound to that lie.

Your worth is not linked to your circumstances. Your worth is not linked to how you look. Your worth is not linked to your successes or your failures. Your worth lies within the identity you have in Christ, and that will never change. That is written in stone. That is permanent.

Stop believing the lie that investing in yourself as a woman is selfish and vain, because it isn't. We were created to present beautifully. We were created to show on the outside what is flourishing on the inside. That's not vanity, that's obedience. That's stewardship. So ask for help. Pray for the right person to guide you, to help you, to steward you in this journey. There are women with open hearts and open doors who want to see you heal and flourish. Reach out to them.

And if you're struggling, if you're in a deep pit and valley right now, know this: you were not created to walk alone. If we were meant to be alone, God would have created only one person on earth. But He didn't. We were created with a desire for community, to be each other's pillars in hard times, to help each other hold our heads high, to pray with each other in tough seasons. You don't have to do this alone.

You were called to stand up. You were called to speak up. You were called to make a difference. You were called to be set apart. The Holy Spirit, the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead, is within you. And that is where we have hope. That is where we have worth. That is where we have joy. Because it has nothing to do with us and everything to do with the power of the blood of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit working through us. He has trusted you with gifts. Use them. Use them for His kingdom.

My Favorite Scripture

My favorite scripture at the moment is Matthew 9:37-38: **"Jesus said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.'"**

This scripture encourages me to be bold. It reminds me that I was called and you were called too, to go and make disciples of all nations. It's powerful. It motivates me to want to know more about Jesus, and more importantly, to not keep Jesus to myself. I want to allow Him to use me in all areas of my life. Not only in image consulting. Not only on a stage with a mic. But in all areas. To go and gather the harvest. To be a worker in His field. That's what drives me.

A Relationship with the Shepherd

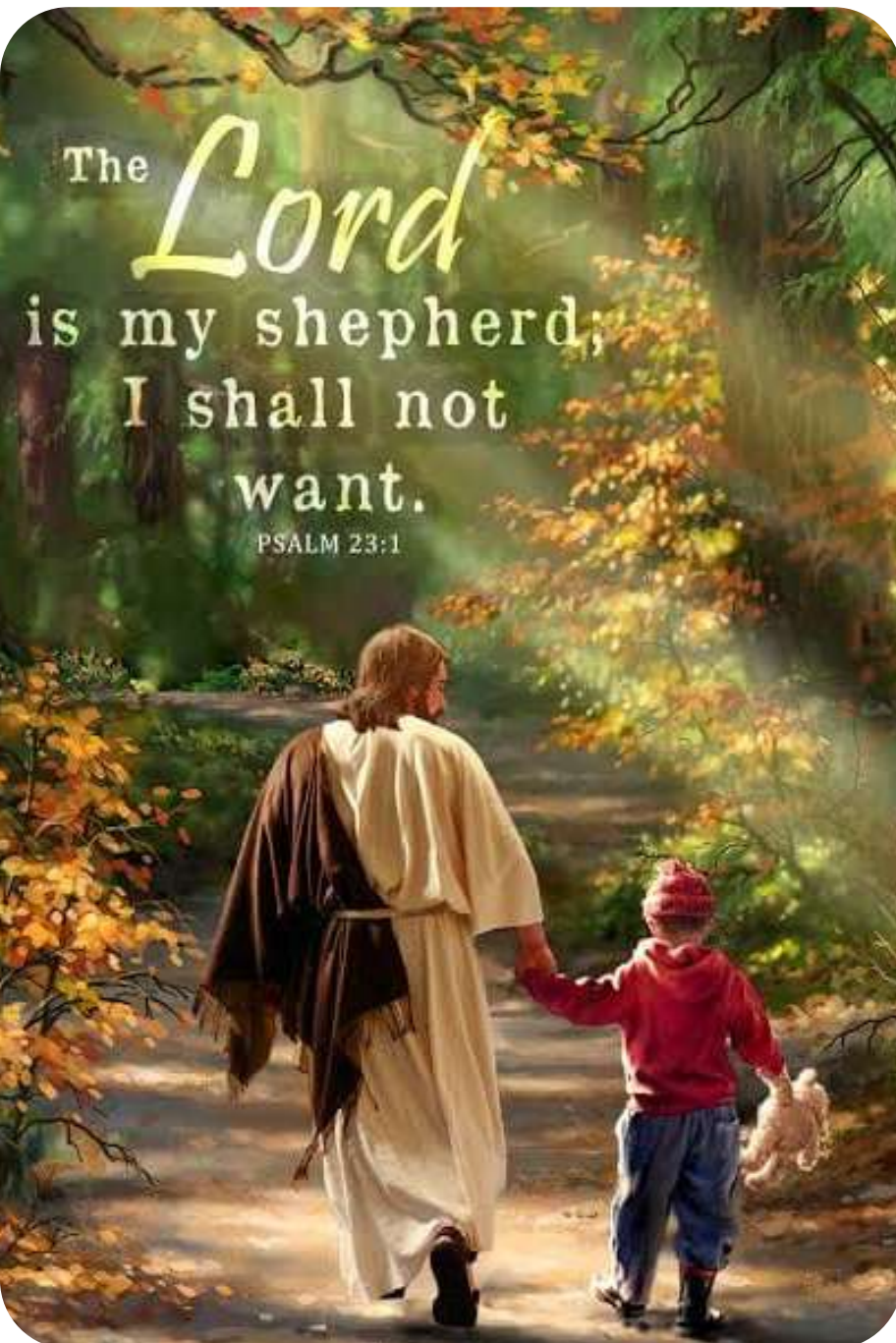

Psalm 23 is a comforting chapter that focuses on complete trust, God's provision, and His protection. It can be read during different seasons of life, recited in times of difficulty, or used for personal comfort. This powerful passage reminds us that God guides us and watches over us at all times.

Remember what the Word of God says in Psalm 32:8:

"I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you."



This reminds us that God is always watching over us, guiding us with love and care.

When we carefully read the opening words of Psalm 23:1 **"The Lord is my Shepherd"** we discover that they speak about our personal relationship with Christ. Throughout the Bible, the relationship between Christ and His Church is often compared to a marriage, representing an unbreakable covenant built on love, faithfulness, and devotion. It points to the eternal union believers will one day share with Him.

Having Jesus Christ as our Shepherd means living in close fellowship with Him.

Our relationship with Him is so personal that the Bible describes believers as being "in Christ." We are *connected* to Him, *guided* by Him, and *cared for* by Him every day.

Psalm 23:1 encourages us to shift our mindset **from doubt to complete trust**.

It reminds us to acknowledge God as our **daily Provider and Guide**, knowing that He faithfully leads us in every season of life.

Psalm 23 is much more than a comforting passage. It is a beautiful picture of the close, *personal relationship between Christ and everyone who chooses to trust and follow Him*.

May we never know the Shepherd only by name, but may we walk with Him daily, trust Him completely, and find peace in His loving care.

tomorrow.

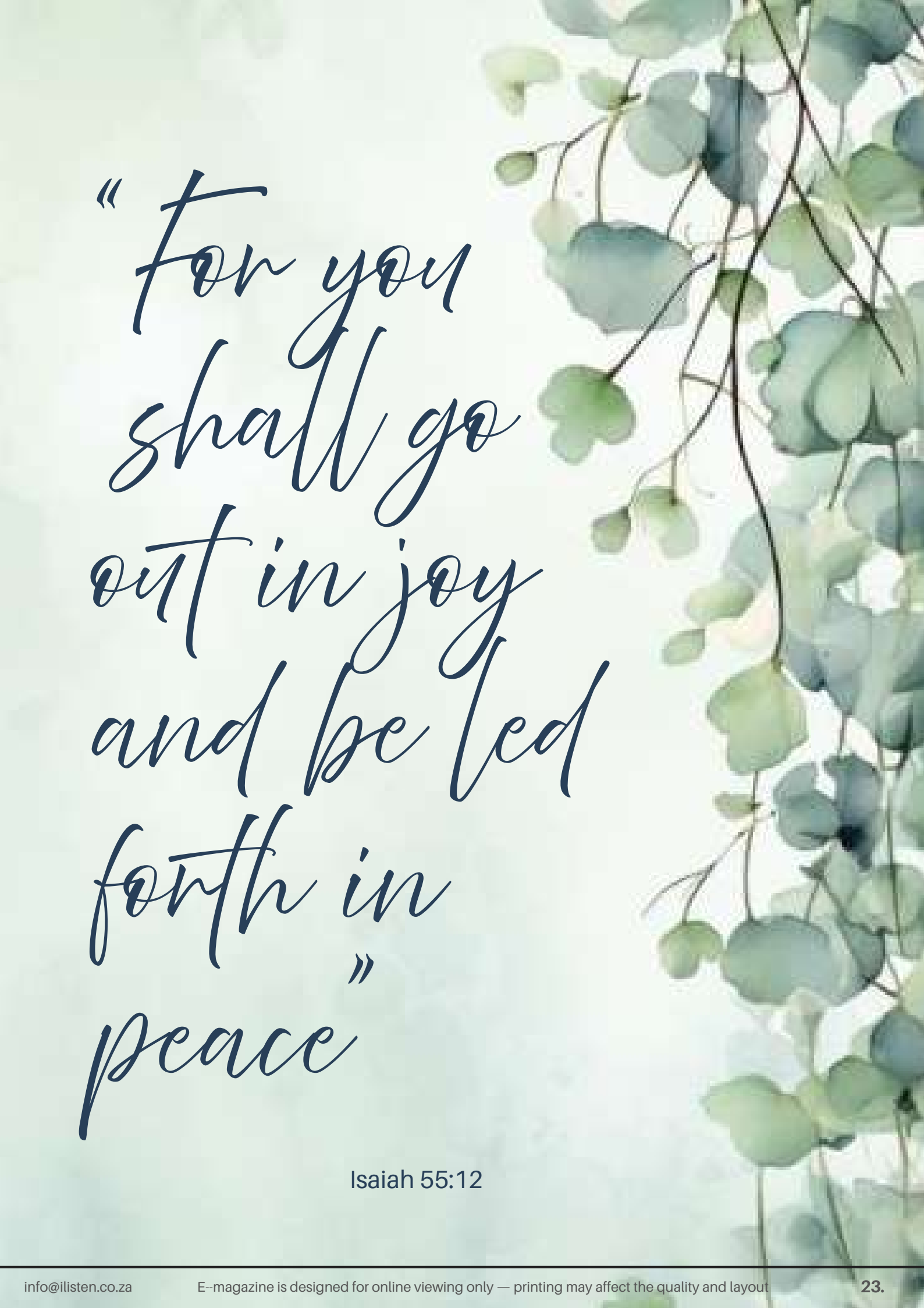

A place to remember that while everything around you may seem dormant, God is faithfully working beneath the surface.

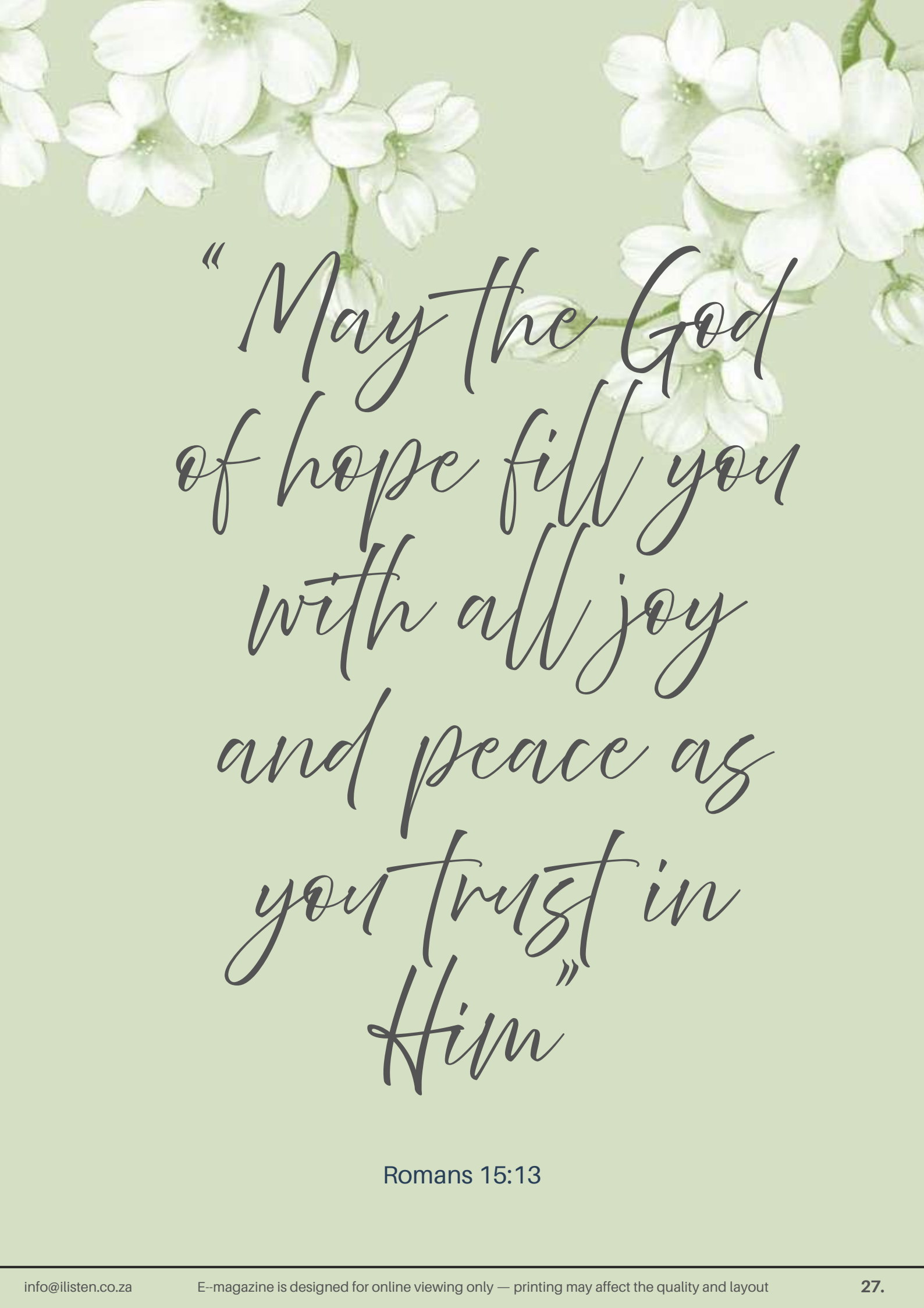
Winter is never the end of the story.
