Nearby Shelter

Trees and shrubs help birds feel safe.

Partial Shade

Helps keep water cooler.

Visibility

Place it where you can enjoy watching visiting birds.

Safety

Avoid areas where predators can easily hide.

Provide Fresh Water

The single most important step

Plant Indigenous Species

Indigenous plants support local birdlife

Create Layers

Groundcover, shrubs and trees provide shelter

Provide Food

- Offer **seeds, fruit, and mealworms** when natural food is scarce.
- **Supplement Feeding** – Help birds through seasonal food shortages.
- **Support Local Birds** – Provide extra nourishment during lean periods.
- **Boost Garden Visits** – A reliable food source attracts more birdlife.
- **Feed Responsibly** – Offer suitable foods when birds need them most.

Reduce Chemicals

Bird-friendly gardens rely less on harsh pesticides

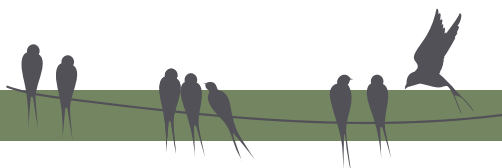
Chapter 10 – Common Birdbath Mistakes
